

Code of Ethics

The journal *Dialogues d'Histoire Ancienne* (DHA) is a generalist journal in the sciences of antiquity that publishes **original contributions, peer-reviewed by at least two external scholars having no conflict of interest with the author**, upon the advice of the journal's own editorial board and board of experts. The experts' advice may be supplemented by further peer reviews in cases of divergent opinions. Peer reviews are always **referred anonymously** to the author. Once the article has been accepted, **a contract is drawn, by which the parties mutually commit themselves** to respect the deontology of academic publication and dissemination. Articles turned down for publication are returned to the author enclosed with a letter from the editor in chief of the journal who, after consideration of the peer reviewers and boards, explains the reasons for the refusal and encourages the author to revise his or her work. The journal is committed to respecting and enforcing respect for the **impartiality and confidentiality of peer reviewing** and **rejects all forms of discrimination**. The guiding principle is the academic value of submissions. Articles involving plagiarism and sources truncated or distorted with fraudulent intent are clearly rejected by the journal. The journal *Dialogues d'Histoire Ancienne* promotes academic dialogue, but no *ad hominem* statements or attacks are tolerated. While the journal and its experts are committed to respecting this code of ethics, authors must also refrain from plagiarism, multiple publication, conflict of interest, and libelous discourse directed at any particular authors.

Open to all authors

Dialogues d'Histoire Ancienne (DHA) is committed to openness and inclusivity in scholarly publishing without author-facing charges for reading or publishing.

We welcome submissions from all authors, regardless of their institutional affiliation, geographical location, or academic status.

Submissions only must align with the aims and scope of the journal and meet the required quality standards once the reviewing process is completed.
